**Secondary School Realignment Task Force**

**Principles of Realignment**  
[In Alphabetical Order]

Consider reasonable split – try to keep large groups of students together as they move from elementary to middle school and middle school to high school.

**Current Neighborhood vs. Future Neighborhood**

- Consider each section separately: maximum impact-minimum moves
- Optimal number for each school may be different
- Some schools may need low enrollment to allow for growth
- Adjust capacity depending on potential for new building

**Data Driven or Facts Driven Process**

**Parents Voices To Be Heard Along The Way**

- Keep people informed
- Create an e-mail link on the MCCSC web site for people to ask questions, share comments, etc. The questions would be brought to the Task Force and responses posted on the site.

**Socio-Economic Diversity Within a School May Be Considered A Factor When Appropriate**

**Task Force Must Consider Neighborhoods That May Not Come Forward To Represent Themselves**

- Task Force members concerned for good of all
- Liaison with home school(s)

**Transportation: Student Time ... Parent Time ... Financial Impact**

- Consider creating routes on roads that have been upgraded (not currently used) in order to shorten bus rides to a school that is geographically closer to students.

**Try to Keep Neighborhoods Together**

- Whenever possible, keep defined subdivisions together
- Look for natural flow
