# Drop-Out Prevention Program

## Who is Eligible to Attend?

The Drop-Out Prevention Program accommodates students who are currently enrolled at Bloomington High School North, Bloomington High School South, Bloomington New Tech High School, or Aurora Alternative High School. Those who have recently withdrawn from high school without a diploma should re-enroll at the high school first and discuss a referral with a counselor to the Drop-Out Prevention Program.

Priority is given to junior and senior students with at least 25 earned credits of the 42 minimally required for graduation. Students will be referred by their high school guidance counselor or social worker and approved by the high school principal. Students enrolling will attend an orientation conference with the administration of the Drop-Out Prevention Program. Students enrolling are expected to finish their high school diploma through this program and may not return to their home high school



## Program Curricula

The program curriculum will be designed by certified MCCSC teachers & aligned with the Indiana State Standards. Student's motivation, effective work habits and the ability to master the materials determine the length of time required to earn each credit.



## Program

- Students will attend the program five days a week for at least three hours a day, either from 8:00-11:00 a.m. or 12:00 a.m.-3:00 p.m.
- The other half of the day, students will earn credits through Career and Technical Ed Courses at Hoosier Hills Career Center or by maintaining employment of 15 hours per week.
- On three of the five days, students will complete course work via Nova Net, or other online sources.

- On the fourth day, students will attend courses related to Orientation to Life & Careers, Reconnecting Youth, Adult Roles, and Interpersonal Relationships.
- On the fifth day, students will gain job skills and participate in service learning by volunteering in the community.

## Attendance

Attendance is critical for the success of students attending the Drop-Out Prevention Program.

## Graduation

Students who achieve all required credits will receive a diploma from their home high school.
