### Greeting Others

"Greeting Others" is a skill we will use throughout our life. It has the added benefit of improving relationships and creating a positive environment. It gives us the opportunity to make a personal connection with each other, show our polite manners, and create a positive experience.

### **The steps for Greeting Others:**

- Look at the person - shows confidence, respect, maturity
- Use a pleasant voice tone - an energetic or happy tone says you are glad to greet them
- Say "Hi" or "Hello" - lots of ways to greet someone
