People are more likely to listen to what you have to say when you use an appropriate voice tone. Using an appropriate voice tone is our focus skill next week at Arlington. In the classroom, an appropriate voice tone can show respect for others who are learning and working to do their personal best.

Your best appropriate voice steps:

1. Listen to the level of the voices around you
2. Change your voice to match
3. Watch and listen for visual and verbal cues and adjust your voice as needed

At home: Sometimes it is important to talk in very quiet voices, and sometimes it is important to be heard. Talk about situations where you need to be quiet and where you need to talk for people to hear you. Why is it important to keep a person-to-person talking voice even when you are upset?
