Arlington Heights is a Positive Behavior Intervention and Support (PBIS) School. We believe in encouraging and supporting positive choices with established procedures and expectations for a safe and positive learning environment.

There are three main expectations for our Eagles: Be Safe, Be Kind, Be Responsible.

These expectations and procedures are in place in our classrooms and all areas of the school so that students know the behavior we expect throughout the school. When procedures are taught and practiced, students understand the expectations for behavior at school. For example, **OUF** cafeteria procedures include:

Be Safe – Stay seated

Be Kind – Wait patiently and use “please” and “thank you”

Be Responsible – Follow directions right away and walk directly to your seat

All students received instruction on school-wide procedures. We will continue to teach, practice, and reinforce our procedures for a safe and positive learning environment.
