Social Skill Week of February 25th – Responding to Teasing

Unfortunately, there will probably be a time in all children's lives when they will experience teasing. It is important that we help them develop skills so they can appropriately respond to teasing. At home, parents can review the social skill steps listed below with their children if they experience teasing and talk with their children about the importance of being kind and not teasing others.

Responding to Teasing

- Remain calm
- Ask the person to stop teasing
- If the teasing stops, thank the person and explain how the teasing made you feel
- If the teasing doesn't stop, talk to an adult
