PBIS News & Notes

Throughout our lives, we will all hear the word “no” more times than we would like. Being able to accept “no” can give us more “yes” to requests in the future. This is true at home, at school, as children, and as adults. Next week, we will focus on the skill Accepting “No” For an Answer. Sometimes, this can be difficult! Remember these steps:

1. Look at the person.
2. Say “Okay.”
3. Calmly ask for a reason if you really don't understand.
4. If you disagree, bring it up later.

For discussion at home: Why is it important to stay calm when accepting the answer? Why would you not want to ask for a reason every time? If you did ask every time, what might the person think about you? Why is it important to wait to talk about why you disagree with the answer?
