Sharing Something:

Students often find themselves sharing materials, space, teacher attention, and friends with others during the school day. Teaching the importance of sharing with others helps students develop a social skill that will serve them in school, at home, and in the community.

Steps for sharing when you want to play with something someone is currently using:

1. Let the other person use the item first.
2. Ask if you can use it later.
3. When you get to use it, offer it back to the other person after you have used it.

Talk about how you share at home. Can you think of something easy to share? When is it hard to share? How can you make sharing easier?
