Graduating seniors will be given for priority for a seat. Seats will then be made available to current juniors, followed by sophomores and then freshmen. 80 seats are available each session. The Plato Online Program will be used to support the curriculum and instruction for each course.

Students may complete the instructional work using any computer at any location, but must complete the pre- and post-tests at BHSN or BHSS. Students are encouraged to attend the sessions offered at both schools for additional individualized support. The online summer school program is primarily for CREDIT RECOVERY COURSES.
