This course will prepare you for an entry-level HVAC technician position. It covers topics on the exam for the EPA 608 certification, which must be held by technicians who handle refrigerants.

This course is offered as a hybrid, face-to-face and distance education course. In the first phase of training, you will prepare for or the North American Technician Excellence Ready-To-Work Certificate by studying component identification, tools, math and measurement, general safety, electrical safety, and basic heat transfer. You will also do some workforce preparation activities.

When you have completed Phase I, you will enter the second phase of training. You will use an online course to learn core definitions, small appliances, high pressure appliances, and low pressure appliances in preparation for the EPA 608 certification exam.
