IT'S TEST TIME!!!

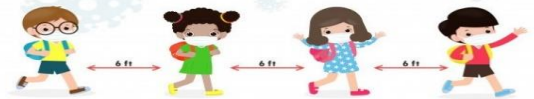

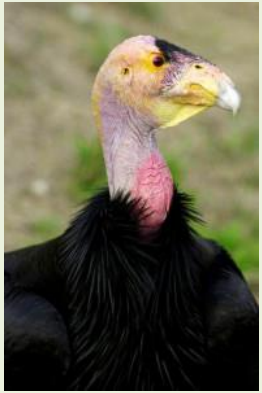

Miss Haire's 2nd grade class is raising butterflies! This is their first chrysalis of a Painted Lady Butterfly.



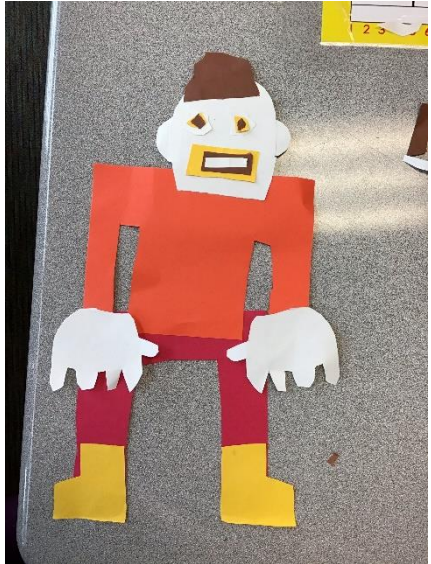
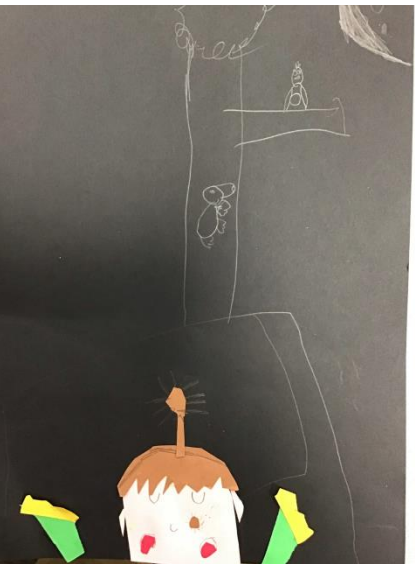
CHANGES TO END-OF DAY TRANSPORTATION PLANS
