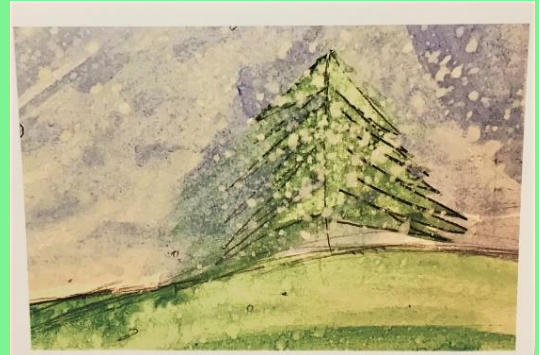

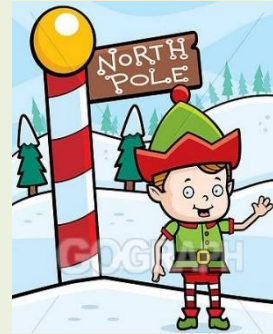

FUN FACT

There is no land at the North Pole. The North Pole is made up of huge ice floes, 6 to 10 feet thick, that float on the surface of the Arctic Ocean. Beneath the ice, the water is 13,400 feet deep. At the North Pole, the sun rises and sets just once a year. There is only either light or darkness. The sun rises around the spring equinox on March 20th and stays in the sky for a full six months before finally setting around the fall equinox on September 22nd. Through the winter, the North Pole is dark 24 hours a day.
