THINK SKILL OF THE WEEK

“Using an Appropriate Tone of Voice”

Ask your children if they know the steps:

- 1) Listen to the level of the voices around you.
- 2) Change your voice to match.
- 3) Watch and listen for visual or verbal cues and adjust your voice as needed.

Voice Levels

- 0-Silence
- 1-Whisper Voice
- 2-Quiet Conversation
- 3-Normal Voice
- 4-Outside Voice
- 5-Emergency Voice

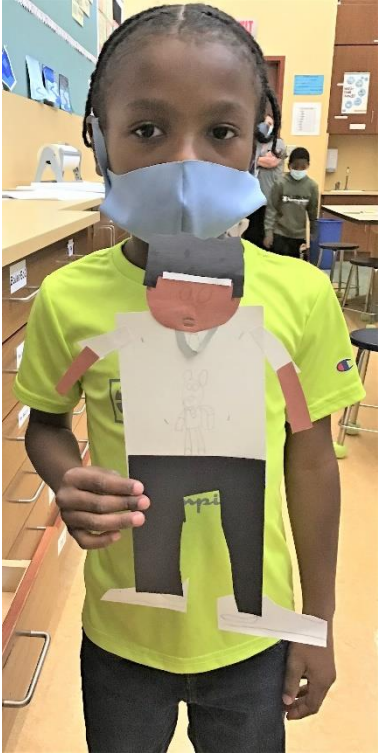
