An announcement issuing a Tornado Watch or Tornado Warning by the National or Local Weather Services is always a possibility during school hours. - 1) All students, faculty and staff will take cover on our basement level.
- 2) Students will follow the recommended safety procedures for the duration of the warning. (Kneeling by the walls with heads covered)
- 3) Until the all-clear is issued, we will be unable to answer telephone calls nor allow entry into or exit from the building. The situation could cause busing and parent pick up delays.

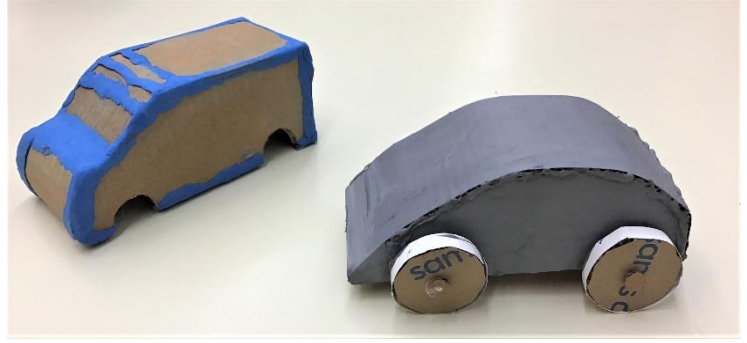

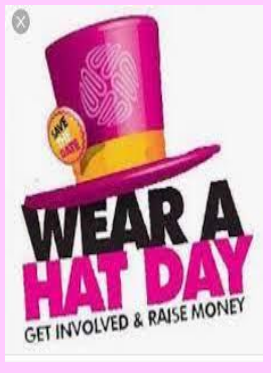
# DR. REYNOLDS' ARTIST'S CORNER
