FUN FACT

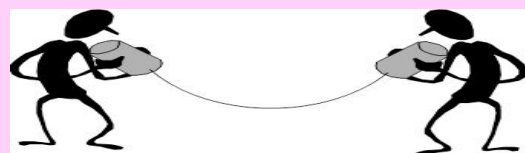
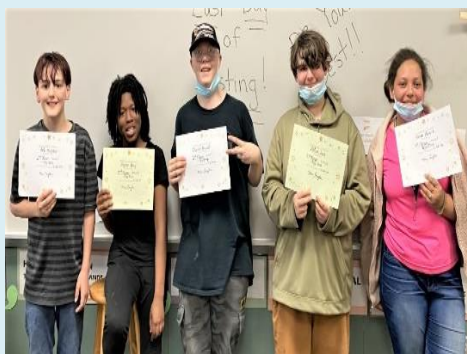
